As every year since 1992, the Espace Européen pour la Sculpture organizes an exhibition dedicated to an artist from the country of the rotating presidency of the Council of European Union, in the regional Tournay-Solvay Park in Watermael-Boitsfort.

On the occasion of the Estonian Presidency in the second half of 2017, the time of an exhibition, three giant megaphones made from Estonian wood, will be temporarily placed in the Tournay-Solvay Park.

This is **RUUP**, an artwork designed by the Estonian artist Birgit Õigus, built by students from the *Eesti* Kunstiakadeemia, the Estonian Academy of Arts, looking for a way to help us all notice and listen to the sounds of the forests. RUUP offers a place to rest your feet, as well as your thoughts. Sit, sleep, think, and listen.

RUUP is an open library with just one book – the nature that has an endless assortment of "audio-books" and it is always renewing itself.

This exhibition will be organized simultaneously with the exhibition "The Bees of Brussels" (Les Abeilles de Bruxelles) of the French artist Jean-François Fourtou, organized by Out of the Box and Diane Hennebert, from June 23rd to September 10th 2017.
